Tips for Working with Children who Speak Languages Other than English at Home



- Bilingual children benefit from exposure to both English and their home language
- Codeswitching (mixing languages) is normal among bilingual children
- Bilingualism is a **net positive** It can lead to educational and work opportunities!

SUGGESTIONS FOR THE CLASSROOM

- Repeat and Reword Increase opportunities to understand.
- Provide Breaks Learning a new language is exhausting!
- **Use Visual Cues** Use gestures, pictures, and demonstration to increase understanding for kids.
- **Print out labels** for objects around the classroom in English and the child's home language.
- **Encourage communication in any form**! Some bilingual children experience a "silent period" when they do more listening than talking.

SUGGESTIONS FOR THE HOME

- Family members should speak in the language in which they are the most comfortable interacting with the child
- Read with the child however possible Reading benefits language development, which supports even better academic achievement
